Retired Master Sergeant James H. Butts, Jr., was born, August 4, 1939, to the late James and Florence Best Butts, in Bronx, NY. He departed this earthly life on Monday, November 9, 2020, in Columbia, South Carolina.

He was known to some as daddy, grandpa, Uncle Jimmy, and MSGT Butts.

James was educated in the public schools of Bronx, New York. At the age of twenty, he enlisted in the United States Army. Then five years later, he met and married, Eloise Green Butts, and together they traveled all over the world to places like, Germany, Texas, Canada, and Fort Jackson. This union lasted for fifty-four years and three children were born, James H. Butts, III, Deborah Butts White, and Carrie Butts McDaniel.

James was a hard worker and worked several part-time jobs. He coached little League ball games, and worked at the Flea Market and Service Stations. Also, he was a faithful member of the Masonic Order and was a Shriner.

Master Sergeant Butts retired from the Armed Forces after twenty-six years of honorable service to his country, earning the highest rank—an E-9. After retiring from the military, he

worked for the United States Postal Service for twenty-seven years.
