Helen met the love of her life, Dr. Henry T. Cameron, who she married upon graduating in May of 1960. She later received her Masters in Education from Central Connecticut State University.

Helen's career as an educator spanned 40 years in various locations to include the New Haven (Connecticut) Public Schools, Nashville (Tennessee)
